

## The NTU Museum Tour Guide

**Campus Introduction:** National Taiwan University (NTU), founded in 1928 as Taihoku Imperial University during the Japanese colonial period, has grown from its original Colleges of Literature and Politics, and Science and Agriculture, into today's comprehensive institution with 11 colleges, 3 professional schools, about 54 departments, 109 graduate institutes, and more than 30 national- or university-level research centers. NTU has nurtured many leading scholars, including Dr. Yuan-Tseh Lee, the first Taiwanese Nobel laureate, as well as numerous national leaders and business pioneers, making it the most influential academic institution in Taiwan. Strolling through the campus, visitors can admire the palm boulevard and century-old historic buildings, experiencing both the heritage of this prestigious university and the evolving meaning of education and scholarship in Taiwan.

### Introduction of the NTU Museum:

Location	Highlight	Stamp
NTU History Gallery	Exhibits focus on the spirit of NTU, the achievements and honors of its colleges, and the past, present, and future of NTU.	
NTU Herbarium	Established in 1929, the Herbarium holds about 260,000 specimens collected from Pacific islands. It also preserves over 60,000 historically valuable specimens collected more than fifty years ago.	
NTU Museum of Anthropology	Originally a small, specialized museum, it has transformed into a university museum with a mission in social education. Its exhibitions reflect the Department's efforts to promote cross-cultural understanding in Taiwanese society.	
NTU Agricultural Exhibition Hall	Founded to present the development and achievements of Taiwan's agriculture and reforms, the building's design incorporates themes of local farming and environmental education, serving as an educational venue for schoolchildren.	
NTU Heritage Hall of Physics	The museum highlights Asia's first Cockcroft-Walton linear accelerator and related scientific artifacts, showcasing the history of scientific research.	
NTU Geo-specimen Cottage	Holds precious collections of fossils, minerals, and rocks, originally gathered during geological research at Taihoku Imperial University. Its cylindrical skylight and pentagonal windows are characteristic features of Japanese architectural style.	
NTU Museum of Zoology	Since 1928, the museum has collected valuable zoological specimens from Taiwan, Southeast Asia, and Hainan Island, now numbering more than 20,000 items.	
NTU Insectarium	One of Taiwan's most historically significant insect collections, with specimens dating back to the early 18th century. Recent surveys by faculty and students have greatly enriched the collection and advanced entomological research.

NTU Museum of Medical Humanities	Originally built in 1897, designed by Kondo Juro in the French Renaissance Revival style, featuring a Mansard roof with slate and copper tiles. The hallways are lined with arches. In 1998, the surrounding area was landscaped into Jingfu Garden.	
NTU Archives	This space allows visitors to explore history through archives and understand the importance of record preservation as a way to protect collective memory.
